Guest Speaker:

Phil Beaty, Vice President of Sales for Nexterra Systems, was introduced by Fred Sverre. Phil grew up on the North Shore and Nexterra Systems was started in their family basement in 2003. Their business is to sell gasification systems - design and build turnkey co-generating energy plants. Their system gasifies wood. The resulting gas can be used in combustion engines to produce electricity – about 65 % efficiency, plus the heat can be used for heating space which increases the total efficiency to near 80 %. These systems are considered carbon neutral energy plants, as the carbon released is re-absorbed by trees. Today they have 55 employees and are growing weekly, adding new members to their staff.

Jeff Pearce thanked Phil for tonight's interesting presentation and presented him with the customary Certificate, pledging to vaccinate 20 children on his behalf.
