Presenter: Bob McKilligan introduced our speakers Andreanna Mazereeuw and Giselle Shareei who spoke about their experience and involvement with the European Union Trade Agreement. They were recipients of a Rotary bursary

that helped send them on a "European Union Trade and Education & Youth" three week study tour throughout Germany and Brussels. Brussels is the administrative centre of the European Union. Giselle spoke about Canada and E.U. Trade and Andreanna talked about Education and Youth.

Canada and European Union Trade:

- Relations between Canada and what is now the European Union are the European Community's oldest formal relationship with any industrialized country.
- Canada-EU economic relations cover a wide range of sectors, such as: forestry products, renewable energy and energy conservation, urban transportation, radioactive waste disposal, information technologies and small business networking services, just to mention a few.
- The EU is Canada's second largest trading partner after the United States.
- Two-way trade in goods and services between the EU and Canada totaled \$76 million in 2002.
- The EU is also the most important source and destination for Canadian foreign direct investment (FDI) after the US.
- Canada ranks fourth among the source countries of FDI to the EU with approximately 4% of total inward FDI stocks in the EU.
- Canada is the third largest destination for EU FDI.
- EU-Canada Transport Agreement was signed December 17, 2009 enabling the opening of markets and investment opportunities.
- Canada and the EU both participate in NATO.

Education & Youth:

- Financial support is available to policy oriented measures involving organizations active in higher education, training and youth.
- Measure may include studies, conferences, seminars, working groups, professional development workshops, benchmarking exercises.
- Addresses joint European and Canadian higher education and vocational training issues.
- Recognition of qualifications and the transfer of credits under the European Credit Transfer System. The Canadian Universities directly involved are Carleton University, Dalhousie University, University of Toronto and University of Montreal-McGill.
- Strengthening of the links between young people in Europe and in Canada.
- Enhancement of EU-Canada economic relationship.
- Enhancement of the quality of human resource development.
- Creation of ways to prepare students for work in the global economy.
- Improving the knowledge of international issues and cultures.

Thanks to Speakers: Brian Hooshi thanked the speakers and presented Ed, Giselle and Andreanna with a Rotary Certificate in their names to vaccinate 20 children against Polio.

Toast to Rotary International: Bryan Chalmers led the group in toasting Rotary International.
