He wanted to become a medical technician so he joined the training program of the Canadian Forces, assigned to the Navy, where he spent 2.5 years for his medic program. After his training he spent one year of duty as a soldier, including being shipped off to serve as a paramedic in Afghanistan for 6.5 months.

He reported on his experiences of war and camp duties, meeting the local people and even spending time at Kandahar Tim Hortons where the ice cappuccino was the most popular drink in the 50 degree C heat. Tim Hortons personnel were rotated every three months at the Canadian controlled Kandahar airport. After completing his duty he joined the BC Ambulance Service as a paramedic.

Catherine Michaud thanked our speaker for tonight's interesting presentation and presented him with the customary Certificate, pledging to vaccinate 20 children against polio, on his behalf.

A related note: Canada has been in Afghanistan for eight years, and in that time 140 of our men and women have given their lives in extraordinary acts of courage and bravery for their country. Cpl James Arnal was the 88th soldier to sacrifice all. His mother Wendy, and brother Andrew, went to Kandahar last September.
