Program

David Spears introduced our speaker, Barbara Toller, who is the development officer with CanAssist.

Barbara outlined the work that CanAssist does to help disabled people have a fuller and more independent life. CanAssist is a charitable organization suported by the University of Victoria which develops technology and services for people with disabilities. It was initiated in 1999 by Nigel Livingston, a faculty member who had a disabled child. Presently CanAssist has a staff of 35 people and assists people with all forms of disabilities and ages ranging from 2 to 100. It develops devices specific to the individual's needs at no cost to the client. To date it has developed over 160 unique devices which are now distributed around the world and receives 5 to 7 request for assistance per week.

The University of Victoria provides support to Can Assist for about a quarter of its budget primarily through access to faculty members, fabrication shops and interested students. The rest of the funding comes from the province, major donors and general fund raising.
