**Presenter:** Fred Sverre introduced our keynote speaker, Johanna Thompson from the Wildlife Rescue Association of British Columbia. Johanna has a degree in geography and thoroughly enjoys working with WRABC. She provided an inspiring presentation on the role and services of WRABC. The Association's purpose is to "promote leadership in rehabilitating wildlife and in promoting the welfare of wild animals in urban



environments". They began in 1975, have 15 full-time staff and 200 volunteers. About 70,000 animals have been treated, about 3,000 each year. They operate a Care Centre where injuries are mended and young animals are moved outside to exercise in preparation for release back into the wild. When possible, animals are released close to where they are found. How can the public help? Gifts and donations are always welcome. Check out the wish list at <u>www.wildliferescue.ca</u>. Before bringing in "orphaned" animals try to first ascertain whether they may have been learning vital life skills from their parents, recovering, and not actually abandoned.





**Thanks to Speaker:** Neil C thanked Johanna and presented her with our highly coveted certificate promising to immunize, in her name, twenty children against Polio, with the intent of eradication of polio.
