


## THE ROTARY CLUB OF NORTH VANCOUVER WHEEL SQUEALS









O Canada: The group produced an enthusiastic rendition of O Canada while facing the flags visible through the window.

Charles is with the Salvation Army. He also manages the Homeless Soccer events on the North Shore. Charles needs our assistance in managing a special International Homeless Soccer event that will take place on the North Shore between May 27th and



June 1st, 2014. The event will start at Vancouver's Oppenheimer Park on May 27th, and then move to the North Shore. There will be 36 games/day and a total of 144 games.

The City of North Vancouver has pledged \$12,000 towards this event. Approximately 250 players and managers will be attending. Cots and bathroom necessities will be provided by the Emergency Shelter. The Salvation Army will provide dinners, and the Alliance Church is providing the bag lunches.

Charles is requesting that our club provide 2 trophies, one each for the men's and women's winners. The trophies may identify Rotary as the benefactor. Equipment bags to be filled with various player requirements are also requested. We can nail down this request at a future meeting. David presented our polio certificate to Charles.

has two daughters and one son. Bob Nowell announced that Margaret Bell, a previous member of our club, has passed away. Deborah also announced that she has our club's delegate certificate to the Lisbon International Conference. The certificate provides for preferred seating. Riet Carter was awarded another Paul Harris Fellowship at this dinner.
