#### Presenter:

Bob Nowell introduced our keynote speaker, Jeffery Hwang, RC Vancouver Centennial (the first Mandarin speaking Club in Vancouver) who discussed their water project in the Chaco area of Paraguay. Mr. Hwang spoke at length about the history of polluted water and associated health problems in rural villages of the country. He had travelled to Paraguay and met with a Buddhist monk named Antonio who was teaching school children how to use their native clay and silt mixed with a little bit of organics to make clay pots. The pots are used for water filtration for drinking water (99.9% effective) and for a water saving method of irrigation for growing crops. His club supports this program to educate children so the parents would also be encouraged to adopt this simple yet most inexpensive proven program (over hundreds of years) to teach environmental health to their people. **Thanks to Speaker:** Fred Sverre thanked Jeffery and presented him with our highly coveted certificate promising to immunize, in his name, twenty children against Polio, with the intent of eradication of polio.
