Presenter:

Our speaker for the evening was Don Evans. Don has been involved with Rotary for 26 years and has held many positions with the Rotary Club of Vancouver. One of Don's strengths has been to assist the Clubs in developing their strategic plans as he did for us 4 years ago. Don is now involved with the Rotary Foundation and he was able to simplify for us the workings of the new Rotary Foundation Grant process.

There are three funds and three types of grants.

The three Funds are:

Annual Fund (Today's fund).

All money invested here stays in for three years and then all the money invested is returned as Grants (50% as District Grant and 50% as Global Grant)

- Endowment Fund (Tomorrow's Fund)
- Polio Plus Fund (To eradicate Polio)

The three types of Grants are:

- District Grant
 - Managed by the District. Each Club \$1.00 is matched by \$0.50 from the District.
- Global Grant
 - Managed by The Rotary Foundation. Each Club \$1.00 is matched by \$1.50 from the Rotary Foundation.
- Packaged Grants
 - Developed and managed by Rotary International directly global in nature, for working with Rotary Strategic Partners.

We are encouraged to make requests for District Grants by April of a given Rotary year for the next Rotary year.
