### Presenter:

Our speakers, Kerri Waite and Maureen Turner from the Canadian Cancer Society, outlined the focus of the Society and their Relay for Life. The Society works hand in hand with the BC Cancer Foundation. The latter focuses on the front line, working directly with patients. The Society has 3 pillars – Support, Research and Prevention. Approximately 12-14% of funds go to administration.

The Relay takes place on June 7<sup>th</sup> from 10 AM to 10 PM at Mahon Park. Typically 40 teams of 8-10 members participate in the walk around the track where 1 member of each team must be walking throughout the event. The event opens with a breakfast for survivors, then a First Nations ceremony and concludes with a remember ceremony with lumination. During the day, there are many activities to interest attendees, such as massages, physio, bands and kids' activities. Participants have a suggested personal goal of \$100 each. The theme is nautical.
