 raise funds for our Foundation. Ticket sales were brisk.



Program:

Kevin Evans introduced our speaker for the evening, Jackie Kloosterboer. She is the Emergency Planning Coordinator & Emergency Social Services Director for the City of Vancouver. She is also the author of "My Earthquake Preparedness Guide".

Jackie started off her talk by mentioning the term "activation" in regards to emergencies and what she does. Activation can be related to any kind of emergency – fire, earthquake, etc.

She then focused on earthquake preparedness and reminded us that, in the event of an earthquake, there will be no supplies available – stores will not be open, etc. Less that 20% of us are prepared. Several of the things she touched on were:

- Be prepared for having to be on our own for 3 days or more.
- Establish a family meeting place.
- Have an out-of-town contact preferably a long way away, like Eastern Canada.
- Have an emergency kit a grab & go bag assembled and readily available containing such things as:
 - o water
 - o prescription medications (keep them up to date they have a shelf life)
 - o light
 - o cash (banks and bank machines won't be open, credit cards won't work)

Kevin Evans eloquently thanked our speaker and presented her with the customary certificate pledging that the Rotary Club of North Vancouver will, in her name, contribute funds to immunize 20 children against polio.

President Daniel gave the toast to Rotary International, led us in reciting The 4-Way Test and, hearing there was nothing further for the "Good of Rotary", adjourned the meeting.
